Use the preparation in accordance with the instructions in the directions for use section in this leaflet. Consult the pharmacist if you need further information.

1. WHAT IS THE MEDICINE INTENDED FOR?

- Antiseptic hand wash
- Pre-operative surgical hand disinfection
- Pre-operative skin disinfection

Therapeutic group: Antiseptics:

2. BEFORE USING THE MEDICINE

Do not use the preparation:

- If you are sensitive (allergic) to the active ingredient or any of the additional ingredients contained in the medicine, especially in patients with a history of possible allergic reactions connected to chlorhexidine.
- Avoid contact with the eyes, the middle ear, the brain and meninges (the tissue covering the brain and spinal cord).

Special warnings regarding use of the medicine

- Do not use in body cavities (e.g. nose or ears).
- Use with care in newborns, especially those born prematurely.
 Septal Scrub could cause chemical skin burns.
- Remove any absorbent cloth, fabric or clothing before proceeding
 to surgery. Do not use excessive quantities and do not allow
 the solution to collect in the skin folds or under the patient or to
 drip onto sheets or anything else that is in direct contact with
 the patient. When dressings need to be applied to areas of skin
 previously exposed to Septal Scrub, care must be taken to ensure
 that no excess solution remains before dressing the area.

Drug interactions

If you are taking, or have recently taken, other medicines, including non-prescription medicines and nutritional supplements, tell the doctor or pharmacist.

3. HOW SHOULD YOU USE THE MEDICINE?

Check with the doctor or pharmacist if you are uncertain about the dosage and treatment regimen of the preparation.

Note

Do not swallow! This medicine is intended for external use only. **Directions for use:**

Do not dilute the solution.

Antiseptic hand wash:

- 1. Wet the hands and forearms
- 2. Add 5 ml of undiluted Septal Scrub and wash hands for one minute
- Rinse well with water
- Dry hands well

Hand disinfection before surgery:

- Wet the hands and forearms
- Add 5 ml of undiluted Septal Scrub and wash hands for one minute
- 3. Clean fingernails with a brush
- Rinse hands with water
- Repeat the procedure once more for 2 minutes
- 6. Rinse well with water
- 7. Dry hands well

- Skin disinfection for patients who are about to undergo an operation:

 1. Wash the whole body with 25 ml of Septal Scrub at least twice.
 - usually once the day before the operation and a second time on the day of the operation.
- Rinse well with water.
- Dry the body well.

Do not exceed the recommended dosage.

If you accidentally swallow Septal Scrub

If you accidentally swallowed Septal Scrub, refer immediately to a doctor or proceed to a hospital emergency room, and bring the package of the medicine with you.

Do not take medicines in the dark! Check the label and the dose each time you take medicine. Wear glasses if you need them. If you have further questions regarding use of the medicine, consult the doctor or pharmacist.

4. SIDE EFFECTS

As with any medicine, use of Septal Scrub may cause side effects in some users. Do not be alarmed when reading the list of side effects. You may not suffer from any of them.

In rare cases chlorhexidine could cause hypersensitivity, including anaphylactic shock (throat or lip swelling and low blood pressure) and allergic reactions (skin inflammation, itching, redness, eczema, rash, hives, skin irritation, blisters). If one of these reactions occurs, stop use and immediately seek medical attention. Side effects in newborns:

Chemical burns (frequency is unknown).

If a side effect occurs, if one of the side effects worsens or if you suffer from a side effect not mentioned in the leaflet, consult with the doctor.

5. HOW SHOULD THE MEDICINE BE STORED?

Avoid poisoning! This medicine, and any other medicine, should be kept in a safe place out of the reach and sight of children and/or infants in order to avoid poisoning. Do not induce vomiting unless explicitly instructed to do so by a doctor.

Do not use the medicine after the expiry date (exp. date) that appears on the package. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.

Store below 25°C.

Can be used for 2 months after first opening, but not beyond the expiry date of the preparation.

6. FURTHER INFORMATION

In addition to the active ingredient, the medicine also contains:

Pluronic PE 6800, ammonyx M, isopropanol, D-gluconolactone, herbacol 15.393/T(B), spectracol ponceau 4R, sodium hydroxide (for pH adjustment), purified water.

 What the medicine looks like and contents of the package: A viscous, clear to slightly opalescent, red colored liquid. Each bottle contains 500 ml of solution.
