



PATIENT PACKAGE INSERT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
PHARMACISTS' REGULATIONS (PREPARATIONS) - 1986

Non-prescription medicine

IODIFLOR OINTMENT

1. Name and form: of the preparation:
Iodiflor Ointment.

2. Composition:

Active substance and quantity / concentration:
PVP-iodine 10% equivalent to 1% iodine.

Inactive ingredients: PEG 400, PEG 4000,
Purified water, Trisodium phosphate.

3. Therapeutic group: Iodine preparation
for disinfection.

4. Therapeutic activity: Skin disinfectant.

5. The medicine is intended for: Disinfection
of infected skin, wounds and superficial burns.

6. When should the preparation not be used?

Do not use this medicine if there is a known
sensitivity to any of its ingredients and
especially to iodine!

**7. DO NOT TAKE THIS MEDICINE WITHOUT
CONSULTING**

A DOCTOR BEFORE STARTING TREATMENT:

If you are suffering, or have suffered in the past,
from thyroid dysfunction.

8. Warnings: If you are sensitive to any type of
food or medicine, inform your doctor before
commencing treatment with this medicine.

Avoid using on extensive areas of affected skin.
Consult your doctor before treating deep
wounds/severe burns.

Do not use this medicine frequently, or for
a prolonged period without consulting a doctor.

9. Drug interactions: If you are taking another
drug or if you have just finished treatment with
another medicine, inform the attending doctor,

in order to prevent hazards or lack of efficacy
arising from drug interactions.

10. Side effects: In addition to the desired
effect of the medicine some side effects may
occur during the course of treatment, such as:
rash.

Effects that require special attention:

Persistent irritation or swelling (rare): stop
treatment and refer to a doctor.

In the event that you experience side effects not
mentioned in this leaflet, or if there is a change
in your general health, consult your doctor
immediately.

11. Adverse reactions and drug interactions

in children and infants: Parents must inform
the attending doctor about any side effects
observed in their child. See above for details of
special side effects and drug interactions.

**12. Recommended dosage unless otherwise
prescribed by your doctor:**

Apply Iodiflor
Ointment to the wound or treated area 2-4 times
a day until the wound has healed.
Can be applied on a gauze pad and covered
with a bandage.
If your condition does not improve within a few
days, refer to the doctor.

13. Attention: Do not swallow! This medicine is
intended for external use only.

14. Directions for use: Apply Iodiflor Ointment
to the wound or treated area 2-4 times a day until
the wound has healed. Can be applied on a gauze
pad and covered with a bandage. If your condition
does not improve within a few days, refer to the
doctor.

15. Avoid poisoning!

This medicine, and all other medicines, must be
stored in a safe place out of the reach of children
and/or infants, to avoid poisoning. If you have used
an overdose or if a child has accidentally
swallowed the medicine, proceed immediately to
a hospital emergency room and bring the package
of the medicine with you.

Do not induce vomiting unless explicitly
instructed to do so by a doctor!

16. DO NOT TAKE MEDICINES IN THE DARK!

Check the label and the dose each time you
take your medicine. Wear glasses if you
need them.

17. Storage: Store in a cool place
(at a temperature up to 25°C).

The medicine may be used for 12 month after
opening the product.

Even if kept in their original container and
stored as recommended, medicines may be
kept for a limited period only. Please note the
expiry date of the medicine! In case of doubt,
consult the pharmacist who dispensed the
medicine to you.

Do not store different medications in the same
package.
