1. What is the medicine intended for?

The medicine is intended for cleansing the large intestine before surgery, childbirth or medical examinations

Before the treatment with Fleet Enema 133 tell the doctor if:

· You are frail or elderly. You may need assistance from a carer or a healthcare professional to use Fleet Enema 133

You have uncontrolled blood pressure

You have a heart or kidney condition

· You suffer from ascites (excess fluid in the peritoneal cavity)

You have had bowel surgery (colostomy)

 You suffer from electrolyte disturbances (changes in the salt levels in the body such as a low level of calcium, a low level of potassium, a high level of phosphate or a high level of sodium)

Consult the doctor even if the conditions detailed above were applicable to you in the past. You may need to be closely supervised during treatment with the medicine.

If you are taking, have recently taken or might take other medicines including non-prescription medicines and nutritional supplements, tell the doctor or pharmacist. Especially if you are taking:

 Medicines for the treatment of high blood pressure such as angiotensin-converting enzyme inhibitors (ACE) (e.g. enalapril, ramipril, lisinopril) and angiotensin receptor blockers (e.g. losartan. candesartan, eprosartan, irbesartan, olmesartan, telmisartan, valsartan) or medicines for treating angina (calcium channel blockers).

Medicines to empty the bladder (diuretics).

 Certain medicines for treatment of mental disorders (lithium).

 Any other medicine that could cause dehydration or alter the salt levels (potassium, sodium, phosphate or calcium) in your body, known as electrolyte balance.

 Certain medicines given for cleaning the bowel (containing sodium phosphate). See also in section 2 "Do not use the medicine if".

5. How to store the medicine
