Increlex Instructions for Use

- ✿ Increlex should be administered **twice per day**
- ✿ Increlex should be administered **shortly before** or **immediately after** a meal
- ✿ If a dose of Increlex cannot be administered shortly before or just after a meal, that dose of Increlex should not be given.
- ✿ Look out for signs and symptoms, provided to you by the attending physician or the nurse, that indicate low blood sugar levels. Keep an edible sugar source with you at all times in case they develop.
- ✿ Use **a different injection site** in the skin for each dose

Change the injection site

- ✿ The abdomen
- ✿ The thigh
- ✿ The buttocks
- ✿ The upper arm

- ✿ If you miss a dose, never increase the subsequent doses of Increlex to make up for the missed dose. The next dose should be taken at the regular time.
- ✿ Increlex should be kept in the refrigerator and must not be frozen. **Store at a temperature of 2°C - 8°C.**

Before using the product, read the package leaflet, which includes detailed injection instructions.
